



On Wednesday 21 October 2020, Women's Justice Network (WJN) co-founder, Kat Armstrong, was found guilty of fraud charges from 2017 in the NSW Local Court today.

The NSW justice system has run its course, and WJN accepts the decision that has been handed down.
